Approvals for school organisation capital projects

Purpose of Report

Cabinet is asked to delegate approval for the award of several capital contracts in relation to school organisation capital projects.

Recommendations

It is recommended that Cabinet:

- Delegate the authority to award the contracts for capital works in relation to Haltwhistle Primary School and St Benet Biscop Catholic Academy previously approved by Cabinet to the Member for Children's Services and the Executive Director of Adult Social Care and Children's Services.
- 2) Approve the allocation of £411,656 'Special Provision Capital Grant Fund for pupils with EHC Plans' to purchase a modular classroom and associated works for Hillcrest Special School and delegate the authority to award the contract for the works to the Member for Children's Services and the Executive Director of Adult Social Care and Children's Services.

Key Issues

Cabinet has previously approved capital investment for the following schools as part
of the council's Medium Term Capital Programme. In order to carry out the works,
approval is now being sought to delegate the authority to the Executive Director of
Adults and Children Services and the member for Children's Services to award the
contract for both projects in line with the previous approvals by Cabinet.

Haltwhistle Academy	Refurbishment of middle school building to create a new primary school	£2.65m	17th September 2020
St Benet Biscop Academy	Expand the school to create additional places, for September 2020	£2.5m	11th February 2020

2. In line with previous reports to the Cabinet, there is an urgent requirement to create Special Educational Needs places across the county. This report requests approval to draw down funding from the 'Special Provision Capital Fund for pupils with EHC Plans' to enable the purchase of a mobile classroom, and associated car park works, to facilitate the temporary provision of an additional eight (8) SEND places at Hillcrest School. Approval is also sought to delegate the authority to the Executive Director of Adults and Children Services and the member for Children's Services to approve the purchase of the mobile classroom, as appropriate, in line with the previous approvals by Cabinet.Summary of New Capital Proposals considered by Officer Capital Strategy Group.

Policy	These works form part of the Medium Term Financial Plan 2019-2022. The plan supports the Corporate Plan
Finance and value for money	Funding approval has already been given by Cabinet for Haltwhistle Academy project and for St Benet Biscop project. The expansion project at Hillcrest Special would be 100% funded from the capital grant from central government to grow capacity for pupils with EHCPs.
Legal	There are no direct legal implications
Procurement	Following approval it is intended to procure the Hillcrest mobile unit via Direct Award on the LHC Modular Buildings framework, due to the requirement to deliver the project for September 2020. Procurement for the extension at St Benet Biscop and Haltwhistle has concluded with contract negotiations underway, with the preferred bidders.
