<p>Oral Health Strategy The report provides an update on progress with the Northumberland Oral Health Strategy. It also provides detail on the evidence to support community water fluoridation as a means of improving dental health and the process which is required to be followed if a water fluoridation scheme is to be varied. The report recommends that the Cabinet take the first step in the process to extend the current community water fluoridation scheme by making a formal variation proposal to the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care; and to consult the Secretary of State and Northumbria Water as to whether the proposed variation would be “operable and efficient”.
