SIF IMPROVEMENT PLAN UPDATE REPORT

1. PURPOSE OF THE REPORT

1.1 To present Members with an update on progress with the Local Authority improvement plan in response to the inspection that was undertaken under the Single Inspection Framework (SIF) in January 2016.

2. **RECOMMENDATIONS**

2.1 To scrutinise the effectiveness of the move to a new Improvement Plan.

3. KEY ISSUES

- 3.1 Progress is monitored and reported to the DCS and Safeguarding Children's Board (NSCB) every two months.
- 3.2 The LA has moved to an overarching Improvement Plan that takes forward all of the key areas from the SIF plan previously reported to this committee, but also introduces new areas identified during the continued improvement journey.
- 3.3 The LA Internal Audit team is currently scrutinising the new plan's fitness for purpose at the request of the DCS. The NSCB, as the agreed external scrutiny body, has ratified the approach being taken.
- 3.4 The new plan monitors the priorities detailed in the Background section. That section shows what areas have been signed off and the new areas that have been identified. Progress on each milestone is rated on a scale of 1 to 4 every two months, 1 being best.
- 3.5 The new plan includes impact measures for each priority area so that the "are we there yet" question can be answered robustly (see Appendix A). The identification of these measures is currently being firmed up and will be complete by the end of January 2018. This process has informed us where there needs to be additional evidence gathering, in particular around surveys, new performance and workforce data and audit findings. A quarterly report on these impact measures will be in place by February 2018.
- 3.6 Highlights from this round of progress updates show that the following priorities remain critical to making further progress: demand management; social work assessment and planning practice; embedding of Early Help models; quality assurance; and workforce development.
- 3.7 The LA will receive an annual children's social care conversation via a meeting with Ofsted in March 2018, where progress on this plan and its incorporation into our new self evaluation will be discussed. This will assist in informing the timing of inspection under the new ILAC framework. It is recommended that this update be brought to this committee.
