Purpose of report

This report provides an overview of the work completed by the Northumberland Safeguarding Children Board undertaken in 2017-2018.

This report is relevant to the Health and Well Being and Stronger Communities and Families priorities included in the NCC Corporate Plan 20132017.

Key issues

- Three Serious Case Reviews (SCR's) that were undertaken during 2016-2017 have now been published. The learning has been embedded through the prompt delivery on the action plans and through a series of roadshows across the County to over 600 front line staff.
- Operation Encompass which shares information about domestic violence incidents was launched across Northumberland Schools in 2016-2017. It has now been extended through the Designated Nurse's work within the Clinical Commissioning Group across Primary Care in Northumberland.
- Children's Social Care Improvement Plan has been presented and monitored by the NSCB throughout the year to identify any areas that they feel require additional scrutiny or challenge.
- The "Onecall" approach in Northumberland, incorporating Northumberland MASH, has been nationally recognised by Sir Tom Windsor, Her Majesty's Inspectorate of Constabulary and Fire & Rescue Services as best practice and should be adopted nationally.

 A review of the information and intelligence considered by the NSCB throughout 2017/18 and analysed through the annual review process suggests that overall the direction of travel is appropriate, good progress is being made and we are in a good place to transition into the new arrangements set out by the Children and Social Work Act 2017

Policy	The new arrangements set out by the Children and Social Work Act 2017 establish the Local Authority as one of three safeguarding partners, alongside Northumbria Police, and Northumberland Clinical Commissioning Group. These new arrangements are being discussed at a Tyne and Wear basis with the Director of Children's Services for Northumberland leading the steering group.
