
Northumberland Joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy 2018-2028

The 10 year Joint Health and Wellbeing Strategy, launched in January 2019, aims to improve the health and wellbeing of Northumberland residents and reduce inequalities. The strategy focussed on 4 key themes:

- Giving every child and young person the best start in life
  All children and young people are happy, aspirational and socially mobile
- Taking a whole system approach to improving health and care
  To maximise value from, and sustainability of, health and social care and
  other public services for improving the health of the people of
  Northumberland, reducing health inequalities.
- Empowering people and communities

  People and communities in Northumberland are listened to, involved and supported to maximise their wellbeing and health.
- Addressing some of the wider determinants
   People's health and wellbeing is improved through addressing wider determining factors of health that affect the whole community.

All children and young people are happy, aspirational and socially mobile

#### **Key areas of focus:**

Ensure that the needs of and services for children are identified promptly and offered at the lowest appropriate level of intervention

Ensure 0-2 year olds from the 30% most deprived areas receive appropriate targeted children's centre services.

Risks to children (including exploitation/.domestic abuse) ) are identified and addressed promptly and effectively

Improve education, employment and training opportunities for looked after children and care leavers

Development and timely provision of services for looked after children

Reduce the achievement gap between pupils eligible for free school and/or with special educational needs and their peers.

Ensure that all children are ready to start school by maximising the number of two and three year olds taking up their statutory entitlement.

Provide the support and challenge needed to ensure that all children and young people attend a good or outstanding school in Northumberland.

Work with headteachers, special needs coordinators, and health and social care to reduce school exclusions and increase school attendance

Ensure that there are the right number of school places in the right areas to meet the needs of all children and young people.
