# Background

- During 2009 NHS North of Tyne carried out a formal public consultation on a package of proposals
  - Following the consultation engagement continued about the redevelopment of Berwick Infirmary
  - In the Summer of 2016 the redevelopment was paused

# Scope of the engagement

- To share new thinking and seek views about the possibility of the new hospital in Berwick being part of an integrated development including health, social care and leisure services
- To share and seek views about some existing sites that might be suitable for such a development



# Why an integrated model?

- A drive in Northumberland by the NHS and the county council to work more closely together
- Northumberland County Council committed to redevelop Berwick Leisure Centre and NHS committed to develop a new hospital
- Holistic approach to health and wellbeing benefits patients and the public

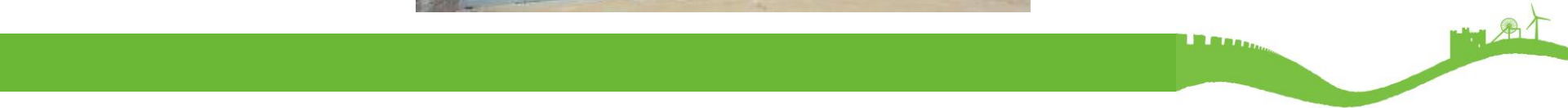


# Other integrated models.....

# Summary of engagement

- Meetings facilitated by Healthwatch with 90 people in 'seldom heard groups'
- Meetings with Berwick Regeneration Commission and Berwick Local Area Committee
