## Gambling Act 2005 - Review of the Statement of Principles

### **Purpose of report**

To seek approval of the Licensing Committee to consult on the proposed draft Statement of Principles for the Gambling Act 2005 which has been prepared in accordance with the Gambling Act 2005 and associated guidance.

Members approve the draft statement for officers to begin the statutory consultation.

#### Key issues

Northumberland County Council as the Licensing Authority under the Gambling Act 2005 is required to publish a statement of the principles which they propose to apply when exercising their functions under the Act.

The statement must be reviewed and published at least every three years. The Council's current Statement of Principles is due to be republished by January 2019. In preparing the Statement of Principles the Licensing Authority must have regard to the Gambling Commision guidance and must conduct a consultation. Officers propose a 12 week consultation in line with guidance..

Officers have prepared a proposed draft statement to be consulted on. The proposed statement is attached as appendix A.



The main amendments to the policy correspond with changes to the relevant guidance.

# <u>Implications</u>

Policy	The Gambling Act 2005 requires the Council as the Licensing Authority to prepare a Statement of Principles (policy) that states its position in relation to its duties under the Act and to guide its work. This review of the statement is in line with legislative requirements.
