Annex 1 - Mandatory conditions

Supply of Alcohol (OFF SALES)

1. No supply of alcohol may be made under the premises licence - a) at a time when there is no designated premises supervisor in respect of the premises licence, or b) at a time when the designated premises supervisor does not hold a personal licence or his personal licence is suspended.

2. Every supply of alcohol under the premises licence must be made or authorised by a person who holds a personal licence.

3.(1) The premises licence holder or club premises certificate holder must ensure that an age verification policy is adopted in respect of the premises in relation to the sale or supply of alcohol.

(2) The designated premises supervisor in relation to the premises licence must ensure that the supply of alcohol at the premises is carried on in accordance with the age verification policy.

(3) The policy must require individuals who appear to the responsible person to be under

18 years of age (or such older age as may be specified in the policy) to produce on request, before being served alcohol, identification bearing their photograph, date of birth and either-

- (a) a holographic mark, or
- (b) an ultraviolet feature.

4. 1. A relevant person shall ensure that no alcohol is sold or supplied for consumption on or off the premises for a price which is less than the permitted price.

5. For the purposes of the condition set out in paragraph 1-

(a) "permitted price" is the price found by applying the formula-

where-

(i) P is the permitted price,

$$P = D + (D \times V)$$

(ii) D is the amount of duty chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the duty were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol, and

(iii) V is the rate of value added tax chargeable in relation to the alcohol as if the value added tax were charged on the date of the sale or supply of the alcohol;

(c) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a premises licence-

(i) the holder of the premises licence,

(ii) the designated premises supervisor (if any) in respect of such a licence, or

(iii) the personal licence holder who makes or authorises a supply of alcohol under such a licence;

(d) "relevant person" means, in relation to premises in respect of which there is in force a club premises certificate, any member or officer of the club present on the premises in a capacity which enables the member or officer to prevent the supply in question.

6. Where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 would (apart from this paragraph) not be a whole number of pennies, the price given by that sub-paragraph shall be taken to be the price actually given by that sub-paragraph rounded up to the nearest penny.

4.-(1) Sub-paragraph (2) applies where the permitted price given by Paragraph (b) of paragraph 2 on a day ("the first day") would be different from the permitted price on the next day ("the second day") as a result of a change to the rate of duty or value added tax.

(2) The permitted price which would apply on the first day applies to sales or supplies of alcohol which take place before the expiry of the period of 14 days beginning on the second day.

Annex 2 - Conditions consistent with the operating Schedule

Fire Authority

The occupancy of the Community Room has been assessed at 100 persons.

Environmental Protection

Provide clear and legible notices displayed at prominent positions adjacent to exits and other circulatory areas requesting patrons to leave the premises having regard to the needs of local residents, in particular emphasising the need to refrain from shouting, slamming car doors and the sounding of car horns shall also be discouraged. The design and appearance to be approved by the Licensing Authority.

Empty bottles shall be stored in a lidded skip within the curtilage of the premises prior to collection. Operationally bottles shall be removed from the public area on a frequent basis and transferred to the skip. Transfer of such bottles to any external skips shall not be undertaken after 23.00 to minimise noise disturbance to adjoining properties.

Health and Safety

The electrical installations must comply with any applicable rules and regulations affecting the use of electricity for the time being in force. All electrical installations shall be inspected once a year by one of the following:

A chartered electrical engineer, or

A member of the electrical contractors association, or

A certificate holder of the national inspection council for electrical installation contracting, or

The local electricity board, or

such other persons as may from time to time be approved by the council.

The licensee shall ensure that a residual current device... (RCD) is permanently installed into the electrical supply system of the premises or as a minimum an RCD is permanently fitted to all electric circuits that are likely to be used by performers and/or any others using or hiring the premises.

Any premises using or employing door supervisors must keep a work and incident record on the premises and all supervisors must be registered with the S.I.A. These records must be made available to all relevant authorities for inspection on request.

Any duly authorised officer of the council shall be given free access to these premises at any time for the purpose of ensuring compliance with any conditions and/or the safety of the public attending any event at these premises.

Any beer garden or other external area used by the public at these licensed premises shall only be used during daylight hours or shall be suitably lit to allow safe access and egress from the area.

Conditions Added by Variation

A challenge 21 policy will be in place and challenge 21 posters will be displayed on the premises.

Happy hour style promotions will not be offered and the premises will adhere to the strict rules for the sale of alcohol

Maximum occupancy figures will not be exceeded

Those bringing in special equipment will be required to produce certificates where appropriate and the wiring will be tested on a regular basis to ensure it comply with standards

A notice will be placed at the main entrance/exit advising people to leave the building in a quiet and considerate manner

Separate arrangements will be in place for non-alcoholic drinks to be supplied

Annex 3 - Conditions attached after a hearing by the licensing authority

No alcohol will be consumed outdoors and including pitch side except on the patio area outside the community area as marked on a plan attached to the licence and with no consumption taking place on this area after 8.00pm.

No alcohol will be sold other than for consumption on the premises.

At least one executive committee member or the named licence holder must be present when alcohol is served and that these individuals undertake suitable training where appropriate.
