3. REPORT OF THE CHIEF FIRE OFFICER

Case 08/09/2017/366

The licence holder was in attendance with his solicitor.

The complainant was in attendance with a family member.

The Licensing Manager introduced the report and explained the details of the investigation that had been carried out into the complaint. which officers were unable to deal with under delegated powers.

The sub-committee was asked to consider the witness statement and impact statements along with the written and oral report of the Licensing Manager, relevant law and guidance policy to determine whether or not the licence holder was a fit and proper person to retain such a licence. It was stated that the burden of proof rested upon the Licensing Manager and the standard of proof was the civil standard of proof.

The licence holder's solicitor also presented their case and spoke in support of the licence being retained. He then answered questions from the sub-committee.

Members of the sub-committee remained in the meeting to deliberate and make their decision and all others, except the legal advisor left the room.

When all were asked to return to the meeting the legal advisor read out a statement on behalf of the sub-committee:

The sub-committee have considered all written and verbal representations made on behalf of the Licensing Officer of the Council and on behalf of the licence holder and have determined that the licence holder should retain his hackney carriage driver's licence as they considered that he is a fit and proper person to hold a licence.

Reasons:

- In coming to this decision the sub-committee have had to consider two conflicting versions of events.
- The sub-committee have given little weight to the instagram photographs produced by the licence holder.
- The sub-committee have given weight to the fact that the taxi passed close to the complainant's home and that there were opportunities to leave the taxi or alert others.

 The sub-committee have not been satisfied that on the balance of probabilities the allegations about the driver's conduct have been proved to the required standard due to the weight given to the opportunities to leave the taxi or raise an alert, which creates doubt about the allegations, and for this reason the sub-committee were not satisfied that on the balance of probabilities this conduct occurred.

For this reason the sub-committee consider that the licence holder is a fit and proper person to hold a licence.
