



A69 Junction Improvements - Bridge End Roundabout

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Scheme background

Schemes identified as part of the Northern Trans-Pennine study as areas of congestion. Dualling of the A66 was prioritised. These schemes would complement any future decision to dual the A69

- Funding
 - The Bridge End and Styford schemes were identified as part of the £220m Congestion Relief fund announced in March 2017 by Department for Transport.
 - The money within this fund is ring-fenced to the schemes announced at the time, with internal revie completed.

Benefits of the scheme

- The overall aim of the scheme is to improve journey times for those using junction at peak times, it will save up to an hour for regular commuters per week.
- Supports economic growth within the North of England – local contractors appointed as construction workers
- Improves access from the A69 into Hexham
- Makes journey time more reliable and therefore the route more attractive
- Aids the case for future dualling of the A69





Progress update & proposals

Works Timeline

- Utilities diversion August 19 4 week period
- Start of main works Oct 19
- East and West Ends Inc. Turnaround & Hermitage retaining wall – May 20 – 31 Week Period
- Extended roundabout in Operation– May 20 50
 Week Period
- Mainline Open by April 21
- Circulatory Open by April 21
- Finishing and verge works on going as required following open to traffic in April 21

Communication strategy and Traffic management updates

- Database of 3000 residents who will be written to and explain how traffic management will work whilst works are ongoing
- Public drop in day date TBC likely mid September
