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					than one keystage in a school. So why not three school tiers where a greater emphasis can also be placed on pastoral care? Explain where the disadvantage is there? Also, there has been an argument about Middle School teachers 'not being experts' in individual subjects and that moving children into Twotier gives more consistency in their GCSEs. That just patently isn't true for these schools and this town. First of all, we have children being taught at the academy by unqualified teachers teaching music, teachers whose background is in RE secondary education teaching GCSE English and both GCSE and even A-Level Engineering. Not to mention the enormous staff turn over which offers no consistency whatsoever. Children who have had 11 English Teachers and 7 Science teachers is commonplace. Compare that to the Middle School my daughter attends. Their Science teacher has been teaching Science to Year 7 and 8 for over 20 years at the Middle School. The Art teacher has been teaching Art for 15 years at BMS alone, the alone the teaching she did at her previous school. The music teacher has decades of experience as a music teacher. I could go on, my point is these are highly experienced, qualified staff who are staying at the school. Building relationships with the families in their community over a long, sustained period is a huge part of school life for teachers. Many of the academy staff are travelling miles every morning to get to work because the school cannot attract or keep many staff from the local area. I feel a lot of these facts are being overlooked with a 'what worked somewhere else might work here?' attitude. The academy staff are not part of the local community save for a scant few.

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					catchment pupils from our school (Glendale) at the end of Year 6, our total pupils in catchment attending our Middle School would be in the high 90s as it was previously, before the move to the two tier structure in the Alwnick partnership. If you look at our Year 5 and Year 6 cohorts, they are in the high 90% of catchment attending our school. This would be the same in Year 7 and Year 8 if they could transfer to Duchess at the end of Year 8 or if Year 6 pupils were unable to transfer to Alwnick which is out of catchment. This is a rural School which can be in the 90% catchment attendance. A model that keeps Glendale Middle School open and merges Tweedmouth and Berwick Middle offering two good, well attended middle schools within a three 3 structure is ideal. Within the 3 tier structure, Glendale pupils would be able to transfer to Berwick at the end of Year 8. This would be a clear educational journey for children, rather than the inconsistencies of the past where we were betwixt Berwick Academy and Duchess, thus raising our attendance percentages. The tide is changing and only 5 of our Year 6s wish to transfer to Duchess at the end of this academic Year. This is the lowest number ever! Our parent and children survey reflect that are becoming happier to transfer to Berwick at the end of Year 8. Keep Glendale open; merge the two Berwick middle schools and you will have two good, well attended schools with a 3 tier structure. Alternatively, consider enhanced SEND provision at Glendale Middle School. We currently have 27% SEND on roll which is above national average. Families send their children to us because of our SEND provision. We are and excellent, caring and nurturing school with a staff that have become specialised in areas such as ASD, girls with autism, anxiety and EBSA. You are planning for Disability and challenging behaviours in The Grove; Engage Berwick and St Mary's, but why don't you

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					consider increasing your SEND offer by using the staff and facilities we have here to become a HUB for girls with SEND or autism; a tranquil, calm space which offers a nurturing environment. This option would also allow Wooler First School to remain on their site, because if you close Glendale, they will not be able to afford to remain. You will be saving money in the long run, buy keeping open for SEND support and provision. We have the resources, the staff and the experience.
