LICENSING OBJECTIVES

a) General – all four licensing objectives (b,c,d,e)

The Licensee shall ensure that all times when the premises are for any licensable activity, there are sufficient competent staff on duty at the premises for the purpose of fulfilling the terms and conditions of the license and for preventing crime and disorder. The Licensee shall ensure that all staff will undertake training in their responsibilities in relation to the sale of alcohol, particularly with regard to drunkenness and underage persons. Records will be kept of training and refresher training

b) The prevention of crime and disorder

- Adequate CCTV in operation with a minimum 28 days storage.
- Bottle bins and waste bins will not be accessible to members of the public, accessible only to staff in a locked bin store
- All bottles and glasses are to be removed from public areas as soon as the contents have been drunk or are empty.
- Effective management of premises, including written procedures for managing incidents.
- Keeping an incident book and daily register which lists incidents and actions taken by staff and management.
- Ensuring that staff receive proper training and refresher training on relevant issues, policies and procedures.
- Contacting and co-operating with police and Licensing Standards Officers when incidents of a violent, anti-social or otherwise criminal nature occur.
- Participating in anti-violence and abuse strategies and campaigns such as Ask for Angela.
- Displaying notices regarding the use of illegal substances or weapons, stating that offences will be reported to the police.

c) Public safety

- Adequate and appropriate First Aid equipment and materials are available on the premises.
- In the absence of adequate daylight suitable and sufficient artificial lighting is provided and maintained in any area accessible to the public positioned not to be visible by residents.
- Fire safety signs are adequately illuminated.
- A "No Smoking" area of such a size and design that it genuinely provides a suitable area for customers wishing to be separated from smoking areas is to be made available.
- All emergency exits shall be kept free from obstruction at all times.
- Ensuring that premises, both internally and externally, are maintained in good, clean and tidy condition at all times.

- Ensuring glassware or alternatives (including toughened or safety glass) are frequently cleared.
- Discouraging 'vertical' drinking and encouraging patrons to be seated by operating a table ordering service so guests remain seated.
- Supporting customers to be aware of the number of units they are consuming, including printing abv of drinks throughout the menu.
- Calling last orders with a minimum of 30 minutes before closing time.

d) The prevention of public nuisance

- All customers will be asked to leave quietly via the front of the venue onto Bridge Street. Clear and legible notices will be prominently displayed to remind customers to leave quietly and have regard to our neighbours.
- Taking a proactive and risk-based approach to public nuisance.

e) The protection of children from harm

- Ensuring vigilance against underage drinking and proxy purchasing.
- Strictly enforcing Challenge 25, and requiring accredited proof of age cards with photographs, or passports.
- Using till prompts so that all till users are prompted and reminded of the challenge 25 process.
- No children or minors to be allowed in the venue after 9pm.
- Ensuring that children are accompanied by adults, and they are able to take responsibility for and supervise the children at all times.

NOTES ON REGULATED ENTERTAINMENT

Continued from previous page...

In terms of specific regulated entertainments please note that:

- Plays: no licence is required for performances between 08:00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
- Films: no licence is required for 'not-for-profit' film exhibition held in community premises between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day provided that the audience does not exceed 500 and the organiser (a) gets consent to the screening from a person who is responsible for the premises; and (b) ensures that each such screening abides by age classification ratings.
- Indoor sporting events: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 1000.
- Boxing or Wrestling Entertainment: no licence is required for a contest, exhibition or display of Greco-Roman
 wrestling, or freestyle wrestling between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not
 exceed 1000. Combined fighting sports defined as a contest, exhibition or display which combines boxing or
 wrestling with one or more martial arts are licensable as a boxing or wrestling entertainment rather than an
 indoor sporting event.
- Live music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o a performance of unamplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, on any premises.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - o a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a workplace that is not licensed to sell alcohol on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - a performance of amplified live music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.
- Recorded Music: no licence permission is required for:
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day on premises authorised to sell alcohol for consumption on those premises, provided that the audience does not exceed 500.
 - any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, in a church hall, village hall, community hall, or other similar community premises, that is not licensed by a premises licence to sell alcohol, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance from a person who is responsible for the premises.
 - o any playing of recorded music between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, at the non-residential premises of (i) a local authority, or (ii) a school, or (iii) a hospital, provided that (a) the audience does not exceed 500, and (b) the organiser gets consent for the performance on the relevant premises from: (i) the local authority concerned, or (ii) the school proprietor or (iii) the health care provider for the hospital.

- Dance: no licence is required for performances between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, provided that the audience does not exceed 500. However, a performance which amounts to adult entertainment remains licensable.
- Cross activity exemptions: no licence is required between 08.00 and 23.00 on any day, with no limit on audience size for:
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the local authority where the entertainment is provided o by or on behalf of the local authority;
 - any entertainment taking place on the hospital premises of the health care provider where the O entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the health care provider;
 - any entertainment taking place on the premises of the school where the entertainment is provided by or on behalf of the school proprietor; and
 - any entertainment (excluding films and a boxing or wrestling entertainment) taking place at a travelling O circus, provided that (a) it takes place within a moveable structure that accommodates the audience, and (b) that the travelling circus has not been located on the same site for more than 28 consecutive days.
