- 1. Noise pollution we have just had to tolerate 9 weeks of loud outside music from another licensed premises in the village affecting our quality of life and mental health. Sound carries particularly at night and I do not see how Rialtos can/will keep the music noise level down as to be unheard by its closest residential neighbours.
- 2. Proximity to residential premises this site is located close to residential premises and will disrupt residents lives.
- 3. Parking this will bring many more people into the village, there is currently very little public car parking and this already causes issues from customers visiting other premises using residential roads as car parks.
