

Notice of Representation

Members of the public can submit representations in objection to or in support of the premises licence applications, within the 28 day consultation period.

Please be aware that for any objections to be considered relevant, they should be submitted before the end of the consultation period and they should address the four licensing objectives in relation to the licensing activity.

The licensing objectives are the prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance, public safety and the protection of children from harm.

Please be aware that where representations are considered relevant copies of the representation will be provided to the applicant and the Licensing Sub Committee.

I live in Dunsgreen, Ponteland and am objecting to this licence on grounds of prevention of public nuisance and crime and disorder.

Prevention of public nuisance

There are 3 other public houses in the village and when live music is played at these venues it can be heard loudly in the surrounding area including at my address. These premises are further away than Rialto and therefore the statement made in point 19 of the application (shown below) is highly inaccurate. I question how the applicant has made the judgement that the sound will be inaudible at the boundary of the nearest residential dwelling.

There is no provision for parking in the proposed plan. Parking is already an issue in the village and if the applicant is presuming his customers will use the public car parks in the village this will have an impact on the surrounding residential streets causing a nuisance, when these car parks are full.

19 Noise from amplified live and recorded music arising from regulated entertainment held within the designated premises, shall be inaudible at the boundary of the nearest residential dwelling.

Crime and disorder

I would like to question point 15 **Overnight security staff will remain on site as a protective and crime prevention measure.** No other venue in the village has overnight security staff. The fact the applicant is stating in his application, overnight security staff will remain on site, is very concerning as if crime and disorder is expected at this venue.
