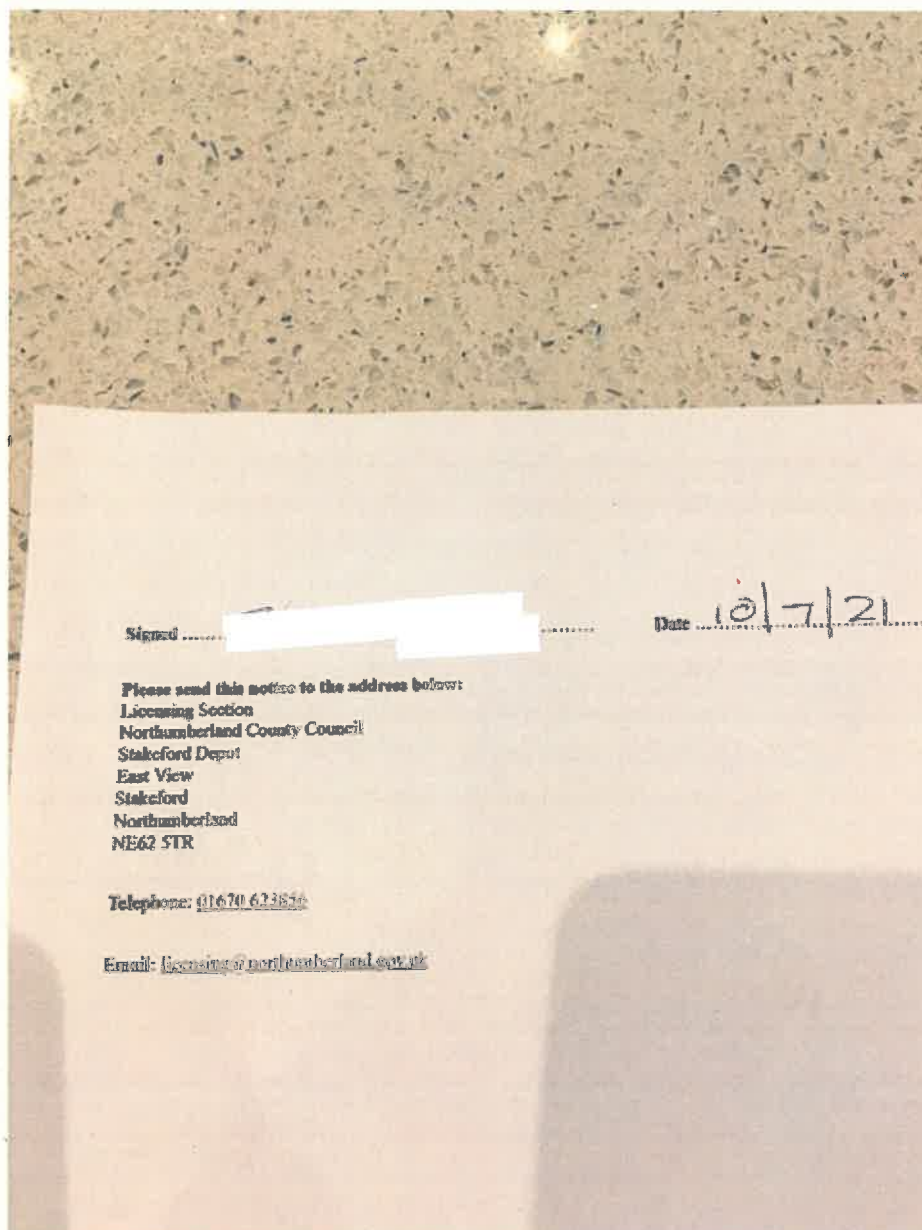
- Crime & prevention and disorder
