The licensing objectives are the prevention of crime and disorder, prevention of public nuisance, public safety and the protection of children from harm.

My home is directly opposite the proposed development and I wish to raise objections to the proposed development.

As a local house owner we are already subject to issues of disorder and nuisance arising from current licensed presences in Ponteland and the increased numbers who will be attracted into what is an already overcrowded location will only make the matter worse. Traffic management in and around the location currently is non existent with vehicles vastly exceeding speed limits especially on Callerton Lane and the provision for more traffic travelling at high speed in a location where people have been drinking until late at night can only be unsafe at the least.

Under the proposals there are no measures outlined to detail how people will disperse at closing time as all public transport is suspended and there are no means for large numbers of people most of whom will have been drinking to get home. It is inevitable that this will lead to cases of disorder and violence, as Ponteland has no permanent police presence this will not take much to escalate and become a major incident.

local resident the thought of large groups of predominantly young people roaming around the village late at night will only exasperate the current issues of low level crime and disorder which will go on late into the night making local residents fearful and disturbed.
