- 1) There are reasons to believe such large numbers (500+ 200 standing) will lead to noise issues in the neighbourhood, - which is a CONSERVATION AREA - particularly with music and entertainment. Noise control would not be possible and unenforceable, almost 24/7 days a week.
- 2) There are safety issues about people en masse attending this site on a busy roundabout off the A696 main route to Scotland. These issues and noise issues would proliferate the centre of Penieland with people not only seeking unavailable car parking but being dropped off/nearby - <sup>collected</sup> thus disturbing traffic flow and nearby housing/residents

3) There is a danger of this application causing copycat "development" throughout Northumberland. In this case the Applicant is obviously hoping for an influx of attendees from Newcastle Area (with possible policing problems)

Ponteland does not need this type of drinking/entertainment venue - neither to profit nor enliven the town. There are 3 adequate Inns and other places to meet for drinks and food. A large number of people walking over the bridge could impede traffic flow and cause accidents. Not to mention delivery vans accessing the land, which has narrow access off the roundabout.
