I write to you with my serious concerns regarding the application for a licence to both the existing Rialto restaurant and the external area to the rear of the building.

It is my view that the proposed application is not in keeping with Ponteland village, a village that is already over provided for with a vast array of eateries and public houses, with more approved and not development as yet (for example the former Barclays Bank site).

Please find a list of my primary concerns

- 1. The application is out of keeping of a village setting.
- 2. The capacity could reach up to an 800 extra persons in the village, significantly increasing the existing village capacity which is already over catered for.
