Reason for Representation: Having looked in detail at the proposed application for a (continue on separate sheet if necessary) planning licence I wish to register my objections to the application for the following reasons:-

b) Reduction of crime and disorder - the potential of 500-800 additional people drinking alcohol in the small Publand village centre will cause an increase in danger and crime. Our Police Service is already stretched and the development could produce extra pressure on them 7 days a week.

c) Public Safety - the amount of extra traffic and lack of public parking will seriously affect the village and beyond making it unsafe for the general public living and using the area. Public pavements will be blocked by irresponsible parking resulting in danger for pedestrians. There will also be health risks due to environmental concerns such as air quality, increased pollution, degraded rubbish and possibly human waste!

d) Reduction of Public Nuisance - All residential living in the town centre and beyond, many of whom are elderly, will be subjected to a large increase in noise and disturbance compared to what there is now. Nuisance being played until midnight followed by traffic and general public noise following can only be described as Public Nuisance. The type of the development will result in long distances in a number of forms including nuisance, environmental impacts all of which is a little
