

Vaccine uptake (12+) in Northumberland




Highest % uptake of 1st doses across UTLAs in England

10.4% more of Northumberland's **under 50** population have received 2 doses than the national average, compared to **5%** more **over 50s**. It is uptake amongst our **young people & working age adults** that particularly sets us apart.

Vaccinating Children and Young People

- Programme to deliver 1st dose vaccinations to healthy 12-15 year olds rolled out in schools from late September
- This was alongside wider offer for all 16-17 year olds (1 dose) and vulnerable 12-15 year olds (2 doses) being delivered by PCNs
- High uptake in these cohorts compared to both regional and national averages, with numbers vaccinated continuing to grow
- Most recent guidance (November '21) from JCVI is for 12-17 year olds to receive 2 doses, 12 weeks apart
- 16-17 year olds now beginning to be invited for 2nd doses as they become eligible – via local and national booking
- Plans being developed to deliver 2nd doses to 12-15 year olds in early 2022 using a hybrid approach of in-school clinics and wider access via the National Booking Service at selected PCN and Pharmacy sites
- Regulatory approval of vaccines and scientific advice awaited from MHRA and JCVI on potential vaccination of 5-11 year olds

Phase 3: COVID-19 Boosters

- Booster programme commenced in late September 2021 to deliver boosters to JCVI Cohorts 1-9 in order to maximise protection in those who are most vulnerable to serious COVID-19
- mRNA vaccines Pfizer/BioNTech (Comirnaty) and Moderna (Spikevax) preferred and should be delivered no sooner than six months after the 2nd dose of a patient's primary course
- Booster CAN be co-administered alongside flu vaccines where is operationally expedient, improves patient experience, and uptake of both vaccines
- Phase 3 also includes delivery of a 3rd primary dose (8 weeks post 2nd dose) of vaccination to severely immunosuppressed individuals
- **128,257** 3rd and booster doses delivered to date to Northumberland residents:
 - Nationally reported uptake: **43.5%** of the population (12+)
 - **60%** of those currently in scope of the booster programme (40+)
 - **78%** of those who are currently eligible, at 6 months post 2nd dose

Where are we now?

- Programme currently at it's **most complex** point with a combination of different priority cohorts, dosing intervals and points of delivery
- Single biggest expansion and acceleration of the programme recently announced in response to emerging Omicron variant
- JCVI have recommended extension of the booster programme to all adults aged over 18
- UK Government target to offer all adults a booster by 31 January 2022
- Booster doses for severely immunosuppressed patients also recommended, 8 weeks after the 3rd primary dose
- As of 8 December, boosters are now available and being offered no sooner than 3 months after a 2nd dose to cohorts 1-10
- Booster offer to Cohorts 11 (30-39 year olds) and 12 (18-29 year olds) to follow once invitations announced nationally
- Additional capacity being made available across all delivery models to enable expanded and accelerated programme to be offered

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
